TEMPORARY ORDER (Sections 134 and 135)

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Saskatchewan Securities Commission (the "Commission") by the staff of the Commission that:

- Pioneer Development Company Limited, Citizen's Life and Casualty Insurance Company Limited, Church of God - Houston, Our Father's Congregation, Melvin White and Jake Klassen (the "Respondents") have been engaging in the trading of securities in 1990 in the Province of Saskatchewan within the meaning of The Securities Act, 1988, S.S. 1988, c.S-42.2 (the "Act");
- The Respondents are not registrants within the meaning of the Act;

AND WHEREAS the Commission is of the opinion that it is in the public interest to make this Order;

AND WHEREAS the Commission is of the opinion that the length of time required for a hearing would be prejudicial to the public interest;

THE COMMISSION HEREBY ORDERS pursuant to section 134(3) and 135(2) of the Act effective immediately that:

- 1. The Respondents shall cease trading in any securities up to and including the 18th day of January, 1991;
- 2. Trading in securities of Pioneer Development Company Limited ("Pioneer"), Citizen's Life and Casualty Insurance Company Limited ("Citizen's"), Church of God - Houston ("Church of God"), and Our Father's Congregation ("Our Father's") shall cease up to and including the 18th day of January, 1991;
- 3. The exemptions contained in:
 - (a) sections 38, 39, 81, 82 and 102 of the Act; and
 - (b) the regulations providing for exemptions from sections27, 58 and 71 of the Act; and
 - (c) any decision providing for exemptions from sections 27 58, 71 or 104 to 109 of the Act;

do not apply to any trade in securities by the Respondents up to and including the 18th day of January, 1991.

AND TAKE NOTICE THAT:

- This Order may be extended for such period as the Commission considers necessary where sufficient information to enable the Commission to make an order pursuant to subsection 134(1) is not provided to the Commission on or before the 18th day of January, 1991;
- 2. The Commission will, at the request of any person or company named in this Order, grant a hearing before the Commission with respect to the within matter, such hearing to be held at such time and place as the Commission shall determine;
- 3. The purpose of such hearing will be to consider whether it is in the public interest that a permanent cease trade order pursuant to subsection 134(1) of the Act and a permanent prohibition of statutory exemptions pursuant to subsection 135(1) of the Act be made with respect to the Respondents by reason of the breaches of the Act hereinbefore described and by reason of failing to provide the Commission with satisfactory information on or before the date of the hearing or any extension thereof by the Commission;
- 4. Any party to these proceedings may be represented by counsel of their choice at any such hearing before the Commission;

5. Upon failure of any party to attend any such hearing at the time and place set therefore, the hearing may proceed in the absence of such party and such party is not entitled to any further notice of the proceedings therein.
