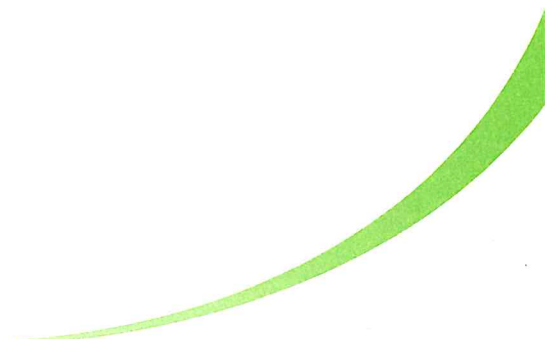

Background:



On March 31, 2015 the Panel of Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority of Saskatchewan (the Panel) heard an application (Staff's Application) brought by Staff of Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority of Saskatchewan (FCAA Staff) for the following relief:

An order pursuant to subsection 158(3) of *The Securities Act, 1988* (the Act), varying the Panel's Decision on Request for Disclosure (the Decision), dated November 24, 2014 to impose the following term and conditions:

1. The Decision applies to each of Dominion Bitcoin Mining Company Ltd., Jason Edmund Dearborn (Dearborn), Peter Scott Voldeng, and Ronald James Frederick Gibbon (collectively, the Respondents);
2. The Respondents shall not publish the contents of any of the disclosure materials provided by FCAA Staff (the Disclosure) on any website or public forum, or post any of the contents of the Disclosure on the internet; and
3. The Respondents shall not release any information contained in the Disclosure to any member of the media or press.

After hearing the submissions of FCAA Staff, Jason Dearborn, Peter Voldeng and Jim Gibbon, the Panel made the following decision:

Decision of the Panel:

Staff's Application, insofar as the first head of relief is concerned, is granted; the Decision applies to each of the Respondents.

The Panel has concluded that the Decision has not been shown to be prejudicial to the public interest, and therefore, Staff's Application is dismissed.
